

Peru's Hernández & Cía in UK architecture acquisition

UK architecture company Building Design Partnership (BDP) has enlisted Weightmans LLP in Newcastle and Hernández & Cía Abogados in Lima to acquire sports stadium design expert Pattern Design.

Latin Lawyer understands that UK firm Solomon Taylor & Shaw advised Pattern Design, but this could not be confirmed prior to publication.

The deal closed on 1 July, with no value disclosed.

Pattern Design is a UK architectural studio based in London, with branches in Edinburgh and Lima.

Pattern Design has designed stadiums and arenas worldwide, including Lima's Polideportivo centre, built for the PanAmerican and ParaPanAmerican Games in 2019. The company's team of 40 architects, technologists and designers will now operate as BDP Pattern.

BDP has 60 years of experience in the design and architecture industry and created some of the UK's greatest sporting locations, including the Wimbledon All England Lawn Tennis Club.
